## Minors and Majors

Please refer to the documents outlining the Process for Classroom & Playground Minors and Majors.

Note: 3 Minor referrals equates to 1 Major.

As outlined in the Process flowcharts, in the case of abuse, threats, harassment or intimidation of others, an e-breach, damage or theft to property, physical aggression towards others, or bullying behaviour, an instant Major is given. The consequence of a Major (detention/ withdrawal/ suspension) is determined by the leadership team, depending on the severity of the behaviour and/or the repeated nature of the behaviour.

## Definition of Good Standing

Every student begins the year with Good Standing. Good Standing enables students to participate in non-curricular activities, in addition to curricular learning experiences.

## Loss of Good Standing

A student's Good Standing status will be temporarily removed following:

- withdrawal (in-school suspension)
- formal home suspension
- **three** Majors (equivalent to 9 Minors or a combination of Minors and Majors)

Parents/caregivers will always be notified by the school when a student has lost their Good Standing, as will the child's teachers.

## Regaining Good Standing

To earn back their Good Standing, the student will need to demonstrate a consistent willingness to behave in an appropriate manner while at school, over a minimum period of two weeks (10 days). A logbook will be used to record behaviour both in class and in the playground (7 'sessions' per day). Classroom, specialist and duty teachers will sign the logbook each session, to indicate whether the student's behaviour has met the Glencoe Primary School behaviour expectations. It is the

student's responsibility to provide the Good Standing logbook to the teacher for signing, in order to earn back his/her Good Standing.

Each afternoon, the student will meet with a Deputy Principal to reflect on their behaviour using the logbook. Any 'sad face' sessions will be added to the end of the two-week block, until the student has achieved 70 'happy face' sessions. In this respect, the student will have genuinely 'earned back' their Good Standing. When this occurs, the process will be considered complete, and the student will regain Good Standing. Parents/caregivers will be notified of this achievement.

### **Curricular and Non-Curricular Activities**

Curricular activities, which all students are eligible to participate in, regardless of Good Standing status, include (but are not limited to):

- all in-class learning activities
- swimming lessons
- whole-school Athletics Carnival
- cultural occasions such as NAIDOC Week
- special services such as ANZAC and Remembrance Day
- Year 6 Graduation Ceremony (Year 6 students only)

Non-curricular activities, which students without Good Standing, are ineligible to participate in, include (but are not limited to):

- all incursions and excursions
- interschool competitions
- non-curricular school events during school hours such as:
  - PBS Good Standing Rewards
  - Easter Hat Parade
  - Book Week Parade
  - Christmas Concert
  - dress-up/fundraising days
  - Colour Run
  - Year 6 Graduation excursion
  - Year 6 Camp

With regard to Year 6 Camp, if a Year 6 student is not 'in Good Standing' by COB on the Friday prior to Camp, he/she will be ineligible to attend, regardless of payment status or how close the student is, to earning back their Good Standing. A clear cut-off is required in order to make suitable arrangements both at school, and with the Camp host.

### **Students holding Leadership Positions**

Where a student elected to a leadership position loses his/her Good Standing, their role and responsibilities will be suspended until Good Standing is regained. Should a Student Leader lose Good Standing on more than one occasion, this will very likely result in the student forfeiting their Leadership role. This decision will be made by the school leadership team, in consultation with the student's teachers. Parents/caregivers will be notified of this decision by the Principal.
